Suggested Itineraries and Pricing

Our suggested **One Day Itineraries** showcase multiple Heart of Brooklyn attractions and additional neighborhood treasures, in a themed format to appeal to groups with a wide range of interests.

Art & Garden Tour – Pairing the Brooklyn Botanic Gardens seasonal tour and Brooklyn Museum permanent collection tour with a magnificent lunch.

Approximate time: 5 hours.....\$37 pp

- Arrive at Brooklyn Botanic Gardens for a 90 minute seasonal highlights tour
- Buffet Lunch and visit the Garden Gift Shop then proceed to the Brooklyn Museum
- 75 minute guided tour of a permanent exhibit
- Visit the Museum gift shop before departing

Suggested arrival time is 10 am. Enjoy lunch at the Steinhardt Conservatory or at the Museum’s Beaux-Arts court.

A Forest Grows in Brooklyn – Explore Prospect Park’s historic landscape, architecture, waterways, extensive birding, and enjoy a scenic lunch by The Lake.

Approximate time: 6 hours.....\$27 pp

- Visit the 18th Century Dutch Farmhouse; the Lefferts Historic House
- Enter the c. 1905 Boathouse, a masterpiece of Beaux Arts-style architecture
- Stand on the Revolutionary War Battlefield, site of The Battle Of Brooklyn
- Explore 200+ species of birds that call the Park home
- Enjoy lunch at the Boathouse Café or in a picnic area shaded by the Park’s tallest trees
- Ride the vintage, hand carved c. 1912 Carousel
- Tour the Park’s watercourse via the whisper-quiet turn-of-the-century style electric boat

Baboon Brunch – Multigenerational fun; Family brunch during the Baboon feeding and more at the Prospect Park Zoo and Brooklyn Children’s Museum.

Approximate time: 5 hours\$35 pp

- During this exciting and entertaining meal, check out one of the most dynamic baboon exhibits in the country. Meet the baboons’ keeper and learn all about the baboon families behind-the-scenes, and similarities between baboon and human families.
- Move on to a sea lion feeding in the Sea Lion Court and other live animal demonstrations. Next, visit the Domestic Barn and feed free petting zoo treats to its residents.
- Soon after, your group will board the Heart of Brooklyn trolley and make your way to the Brooklyn Children’s Museum to experience the “Wild World” interactive exhibit. Young and younger guests will get up close and personal with basilisks, a king snake, a toad, and other dwellers of the rainforest, desert, and woodland terrariums. Learn about camouflage, mimicry, and other adaptation techniques on your day of exciting sights, tastes and friends!

Prospect Park Travel Adventure – A three-part journey for all ages, on land, water, and through time on our vintage c. 1912 Carousel.

Approximate time: 4.5 hours\$22 pp

- Your journey begins with a narrated trolley tour of the 526-acre urban oasis located in the heart of Brooklyn. Explore the rolling Long Meadow, the Nethermead, a fairytale like clearing in the woods, and the Park’s lovingly restored Ravine, a waterfall studded gorge cutting through the center of Brooklyn’s only forest.
- Stop at the stunning 1905 terra cotta Beaux Arts-style Boathouse, home to the Prospect Park Audubon Center. Young and younger adventurers will then explore the Park’s waterways on board the *Independence*, a whisper quiet, turn-of-the-century-style electric boat.
- Following the narrated ride it’s only a short trip to go back, back, back in time aboard the vintage, hand carved c. 1912 Carousel. Children of all ages will thrill at the beauty of this fully restored carnival centerpiece, brought to the Park from its original Coney Island home in the early 1950’s and still galloping after more than 90 years! Lunch will be provided at the Boathouse Café or in a picnic area shaded by the Park’s tallest trees.

African Origins, Brooklyn Roots – Combine the acclaimed collections of the Brooklyn Museum with a visit to nearby landmarks rich in historic and cultural significance.

Approximate time: 6 hours..... \$35 pp

- Visit the Brooklyn Museum for a guided tour of American Identities with stops in the Arts of Africa galleries
- Visit Historic Weeksville, site of the original Free African-American Community
- Explore the “Grand Central Depot” of the Underground Railroad located beneath the 158 year-old Plymouth Church
- Enjoy lunch and shopping in “Bogolan”, Fort Greene’s vibrant Afro-Centric neighborhood

Revolutions: The Battle of Brooklyn – Follow the historic route of General Washington through Prospect Park to the shadow of the Brooklyn Bridge.

Approximate time: 4 hours.....\$30 pp

- Visit Prospect Park’s historic Battle Pass, site of the Maryland Militiamen’s brave charge of the British, which allowed Washington’s successful escape from Brooklyn Heights via the East River
- Explore The Old Stone House, site of the final stand of abandoned Revolutionaries, and clubhouse of the Brooklyn Dodgers in their earliest years
- Tour Brooklyn Heights, and proceed to the East River, site of Washington’s silent escape
- Lunch in Brooklyn Heights under the shadow of the Brooklyn Bridge
