## Brooklyn Botanic Garden

The 52-acre Brooklyn Botanic Garden is New York City's natural wonder. It includes many specialty gardens, including the first Japanese Garden in the US; one of the most diverse Rose Garden collections in the US; a Shakespeare, Herb, and Fragrance Garden; the Steinhardt Conservatory containing tropical, desert, temperate pavilions, aquatic house with renowned orchids, and the C.V. Starr Bonsai Museum.

## Brooklyn Children's Museum

Discover world culture and natural science on an interactive learning adventure at the world's first Museum for kids! An interactive world of fun awaits in the Museum's nine exhibit galleries where children can meet live animals, play musical instruments from around the world, study plants, run a pizza shop, or learn about faraway lands through a permanent collection of over 30,000 objects and specimens.

## Brooklyn Museum

Housed in a 560,000-square-foot Beaux Arts building, the Brooklyn Museum is the second-largest art museum in New York City and one of the largest in the country. Its world-renowned permanent collections include more than one-million objects, from ancient Egyptian masterpieces to contemporary art, and represent a wide range of cultures.

## Brooklyn Public Library

Each year, more than 1.5 million people — almost the equivalent of the entire population of Brooklyn — use the Central Library. The library's notable architecture was created to resemble an open book, with the spine on Grand Army Plaza and the building's two wings opening like pages onto Eastern Parkway and Flatbush Avenue.

## Prospect Park: The Jewel of Brooklyn

Rich in nature and history, Prospect Park offers visitors a wide array of activities, from birding and boating to sports and picnicking, all to be enjoyed in one of the world's most breathtaking and renowned urban parks. The Park boasts a stunning array of natural features, including Brooklyn's only forest, a 60-acre lake, and beautiful waterfalls. Prospect Park is also the site of over 300 years of history, including the nation's first urban Audubon Center, housed inside a c. 1905 Boathouse, a vintage, hand carved c. 1912 Carousel, an 18th century Dutch farmhouse, and the site of the Revolutionary War's Battle of Brooklyn.

## Prospect Park Zoo

The Prospect Park Zoo is home to over 90 species of animals including kangaroos, baboons, sea lions, red pandas, lorries, pythons, and more. Three major exhibit areas are designed to engage visitors in a deeper understanding of wildlife: The World of Animals, Animal Lifestyles, and Animals in Our Lives. The Prospect Park Zoo's education department offers year-round classes and programs, too, for school groups and the general public.
